In the heart of Clos de los Siete, Bodega DiamAndes produces intense, complex, elegant and well-balanced wines. Located at the foothill of the Andes, DiamAndes is a single block of 130 ha at 1100 meters a.s.l. With its unique terroir, combined with the Bordeaux know-how of the owner family and the Argentinean team, it gives birth to distinguished and stylish wines.

The vine training is based on the concept of sustainable farming and global environmental care. The process is entirely done by gravity flow system, with 64 small thermo-regulated stainless steel vats with a double cap system.

Estate Bottle Wine : crop from our own grapes, wines raised and bottled at the winery
Certified Sustainable and Vegan wines.

DiamAndes Grande Reserve 2019 Malbec - Cabernet-Sauvignon

Total area 130 ha (321 acres), 123 ha (303 acres) with red and 7 ha (17 acres) with white.

Grape varieties planted Malbec, Cabernet-Sauvignon, Cabernet-Franc, Syrah, Merlot and Petit Verdot. Chardonnay and Viognier.

Harvest Hand-picking in 12Kg crates, refrigerated in cooling room, double manual selection.

Soil Majority of sand, silt and clay with plenty of pebbles. Altitude of 1100mt

Vine Care Vertical trailing system, leaf thinning by hand. Manual harvest, 100% of the crop is from our own grapes.

Vinification Maceration and fermentation in stainless steel tanks. Estate bottled wine.

DiamAndes Grande Reserve 2019 Vintage :

Date of harvest 25th to 29th of April 2019.

Blend 75% Malbec - 25% Cabernet-Sauvignon

Ageing 18 months in French oak barrels, 50% new oak.

Alcohol 14,5 %

Winemaker Ramiro Balliro.

Description

The palate offers a fresh entry with silky tannins and a long finish. It stands out for its great balance. Intense purple-red color. On the nose it presents complex notes of aromatic herbs such as thyme. Fruit notes also emerge, red and purple. On the palate its tannins are silky, its acidity is balanced and is distinguished by its long finish.

The 2019 Grande Reserve is a blend of 75% Malbec and 25% Cabernet Sauvignon from Campo Los Andes in the Uco Valley and was aged for 18 months in 50% new French oak barrels. In the glass it's garnet-red with a purple sheen. The nose offers balsamic notes alongside ripe plum, mountain herbs and redcurrant against a cedar backdrop. Indulgent and creamy, it has plush tannins and a well-balanced acidity, resulting in a smooth, velvety mouthfeel. This is a rich, rewarding, high-altitude blend from a mild year.

This is the top lineup of wines from DiamAndes. This bottling is a blend of 75/25 Malbec/Cabernet Sauvignon. Deep purple in color, ruby at the rim, opaque and bright. The nose has plums, cassis, dark chocolate, baking spice and slight char. Firm tannins. Full bodied. Good balance. On the palate, black cherries, plums, slight cassis with underlying spice and char. Good finish. This is still young and should improve with good cellaring. It has nice depth and complexity and is more concentrated than the other red offerings. Great on its own, it will need bigger foods to stand up to it for now. It would be a great match for a roasted brisket. Drink over the next ten years.
